

Character Mix Up

While reading a story, change the name of a character to your child's name. You can also change other characters in the story to the name of family members or friends.



A great way to build reading comprehension is to ask your child questions before and after reading a story.

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HELLO, GROWNUPS!



Play, talk, sing write, and read with your child every day to build language skills and help them become a reader.



Pre-readers learn about the world through play, which helps them understand stories.



Pre-readers learn by listening to you talk and joining in the conversation.



Singing together increases awareness of the sounds of words.



Writing helps pre-readers learn that letters and words stand for sounds. and that printed text has meaning.



Shared reading is the most effective way to help children become good readers.

No Cook Playdough Recipe:


• Flour Salt

Liquid


• Oil

- Water (boiling) 4. Play.


